Among them, Montreux Jazz Festival where Diana became famous almost overnight. She was asked to do the opening night of The Montreux Jazz Festival at the Quincy Jones Hall along with Hermetto Pascoal and Margareth Menezes.

Because of this memorable performance, Quincy Jones himself came to Diana to praise her after the concert , he could not say enough about her singing and stage 'magic' to all concerned, later reported by the Press.

Montreux Jazz Festival became a turning point in Diana's career. The performance was recorded live on video and on a CD, (her second album). This concert took place in the Miles Davis Hall and her orchestra was composed of different musicians all of whom have a different musical style. These distinguished musicians found a great affinity in this concert, joined together by Diana's magnetism and sheer musical strength.

In this album she sings her own version of Chico Buarque and Weather Report, allowing her musicians' creativity to express their own musical emotions which illustrates Diana's individual combination her passion for music.

After this spectacular concert, for the next three years, Diana Miranda toured Europe to promote this album in other major music festivals: Mainz (Germany), Vienna, Moncalvo & Rome (Italy), Lancaster (UK), Gampel (Switzerland), Cannes, (France) The « Ritmos do Mundo Festival » at Porto, (Portugal).
